



School Board Trustee Candidates

How do I file my nomination?

Candidates running for the Office of Trustee, **Greater Essex County District School Board** (English Public), representing electors in the Towns of Essex and Kingsville, must file their Nomination Paper with Clerk of the Town of Kingsville, 2021 Division Road North, Kingsville.

Candidates running for the Office of Trustee, **Windsor Essex Catholic District School Board** (English Separate), representing electors in the Municipality of Leamington, Towns of Essex and Kingsville, and Township of Pelee must file their Nomination Paper with the Clerk of the Municipality of Leamington, 111 Erie Street N, Leamington.

Candidates running for the Office of Trustee, **Conseil scolaire catholique Providence** (French Separate), representing the Towns of Amherstburg, Essex and Kingsville must file their Nomination Paper with the Clerk of the Town of Amherstburg, 271 Sandwich Street South, Amherstburg.

Candidates running for the Office of Trustee, **Conseil scolaire Viamonde** (French Public), representing electors in Windsor Essex County must file their Nomination Paper with the Clerk's Office in the City of Windsor, 350 City Hall Square, Windsor City Hall.

NOTE: The requirement to submit 25 nomination signatures does not apply to School Board Trustee positions.

Who is eligible to run for School Board Trustee?

To run for a trustee position on a school board, you must be eligible to vote in that school board election and meet the following requirements:

- Be a Canadian Citizen;
- Be at least 18 years of age or older;
- Be a resident within the jurisdiction of the Board;
- Not be prohibited from voting under Section 17(3) of the Municipal Elections Act, or under any other law; and
- Must meet any other qualifications for the school board (i.e. Roman Catholic, French language rights holder).
